SCRIPTURE PASSAGE: 1 Timothy 4:11-16

¹¹ Command and teach these things. ¹² Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. ¹³ Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to exhortation, to teaching. ¹⁴ Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophecy when the council of elders laid their hands on you. ¹⁵ Practice these things, immerse yourself in them, so that all may see your progress. ¹⁶ Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers. ¹

Review It

This verse is often used to remind young people to remain faithful and strong. Yet, often the second portion of verse 12 if ignored or minimized at times. Why do you believe this is so? What are the five-fold steps of godliness that Paul gave Timothy and why do they matter for pastors?

What about Christians who are not pastors? How do these verses relate to them?

What do you think are some of the greatest pressures that pastors in our churches today face regarding expectations? How should the church respond?

When Paul states "Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers." How does "saving" take place in this instance? What do you believe Paul is referencing here?
